Grace: To offer my heart to Jesus, Who became man for me.

Scripture: Luke 2. All went to be enrolled, each to his own town. And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem; to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. [v1-7]

Quote: Seeing the place, with the sight of the imagination, looking at the place of the Nativity. To see the persons; that is, to see Our Lady and Joseph and, the Child Jesus. I, making myself a poor creature and an unworthy *servant*, looking at them and serving them in their needs. And contemplate what they are saying.
